**-OTE** [all, entire, whole]

The usage of **-OTE** varies from one noun class to another.

**11.** Tulienda mkahawani na familia **yote**.

[We went to the restaurant with the entire/whole/all of the family.]

**12.** Tumerudi / tumerejea na familia **yote**.

[We have returned/come back with the entire/ whole/all of the family.]

[The students will buy any newspapers.]

3. Marashi **yoyote** yatafaa.

[Any perfume will do.]

4. Nyumba **yoyote** itajengwa.

[Any house will be built.]

Nyumba **zozote** zitajengwa.

[Any houses will be built.]

5. Chakula **chochote** kitaliwa na wageni.

[Any food will be eaten by guests.]

Vyakula **vyovyote** vitaliwa na wageni.

[Any foods will be eaten by guests.]

6. Ninapenda mchezo **wowote**.

[I like any sport.]

Ninapenda michezo **yoyote**.

[I like any sports.]

7. Sipendi chakula **chochote**.

[I don't like any food.]

Sipendi vyakula **vyovyote**.

[I don't like any foods.]

8. Ninapenda pahali **popote**.

[I like any place.]

9. Nitaenda pahali **popote** wakati wa likizo.

[I will go to any place during the holiday.]

10. Ninataka kuishi pahali **popote** Marekani.

[I want to live in any place in America.]

**11.** Nitaishi pahali **popote** Marekani.

[I will live in any place in America.]

**12.** Nitaifanya kazi pahali / mahali **popote** Marekani baada ya shule.

[I will work in any place in America after school.]

**13.** Mwanafunzi **yeyote** atafanya mtihani.

[Any student will do the exam.]

Wanafunzi **wowote** watafanya mtihani.

[Any students will do the exam.]
